Other Stuff:

- Convolvulus cneorum prefers well-draining soil or mounded soil where water can run off.
- Bush Morning Glory does best with some shearing every couple of years to keep the plant from getting too leggy.
- Plant Bush Morning Glory where it will get ample sun; filtered or part sun may cause the plant to become leggy.
