

Botanical Name: *Glandularia gooddingii*

Common Name: Gooding's Verbena



Family: Verbenaceae

Native Distribution: Dry open areas throughout the SW United States

Plant Size: 4-18" tall, perennial

Flowers: Up to 3" pink to purple rounded clusters on top of square stems; blooms February to September (can bloom all year)

Foliage: Bright green, deeply divided 1.5" long and 1" wide hairy leaves

Site Preferences: Full sun to part shade, well draining soil

Landscape Uses: Use mixed with other perennials, as a groundcover, or with fragrance.

Other Stuff:

- Has a spicy scent.
- Can use soil amendments to make them lush, but much shorter-lived.
- Trim it after it finishes blooming as it tends then to look straggly.
- Replace the plants every few years.
- Fast growing to 2' tall, 4' diameter.
