

Botanical Name: *Tecoma x 'Orange Jubilee'*

Common Name: Orange Jubilee



Family: Bignoniaceae

Habitat: Washes, rocky slopes, gravelly foothills

Native Distribution: Mexico, Central America, South America

Elevation: 2,000 to 6,000 ft

Hardiness: 25°F

Type: Semi-evergreen

Size: 10' tall x 6' wide

Shape: Upright, more dense

Growth Rate: Fast

Flowers: Clusters of 2" orange trumpet flowers

Bloom Season: Spring through early winter

Fruit: Narrow 5" green pods

Foliage: 2-3" medium-green leaflets on compound leaves with toothed margins

Exposure: Full/reflected sun

Shade: Filtered

Water Requirements: Moderate

***Tecoma x 'Orange Jubilee'* (Orange Jubilee) in**

Phoenix xeriscapes: Use Orange Jubilee in a mass planting against a wall or as an informal border or around a swimming pool. Also a good choice for medians and parking areas. Excellent in Phoenix xeriscapes where summer or prolonged color is needed. Some litter, no thorns.

Wildlife: Attracts bees, hummingbirds, and other birds.

More about *Tecoma x 'Orange Jubilee'* (Orange Jubilee):

- Orange Jubilee will be evergreen in Phoenix xeriscapes, but will be deciduous in colder, outlying areas.
- Can freeze to the ground below 20° but will make a fast recovery.
- Prune *Tecoma x 'Orange Jubilee'* in late winter after the threat of frost has passed.
- Has fewer seed pods than *Tecoma stans* v. *angustata* so less litter.
- Promote blooming of *Tecoma x 'Orange Jubilee'* with bi-monthly soaking in the summer.
