

**Botanical Name:** *Tetraneuris acaulis* (formerly *Hymenoxys acaulis*)

**Common Name:** Angelita Daisy



**Family:** Asteraceae

**Habitat:** Dry, rocky soils, sandy plains, mesas

**Native Distribution:** SW United States

**Elevation:** 4,000 to 6,000 ft

**Hardiness:** -10°F

**Type:** Evergreen

**Size:** 8" tall x 1' wide

**Shape:** Round mound

**Growth Rate:** Fast

**Flowers:** 1-2" yellow-gold daisy-like blooms on leafless stems

**Bloom Season:** All year but most profusely in spring

**Fruit:** Brownish seed heads

**Foliage:** Hairy, grayish-green narrow leaves around the base of the plant

**Exposure:** Full to part sun

**Shade:** N/A

**Water Requirements:** Low

**In the Landscape:** Excellent plant to fill in small spaces, to use in borders, entryways, walkways, wildflower gardens, perennial gardens, patios, or anywhere the persistent blooms can be appreciated. Little to no maintenance or litter.

**Wildlife:** Attracts birds and butterflies.

**Other Stuff:**

- Distinguished by its leafless stems (Greek "acaulis" means a stem without leaves).
- Remove spent flower heads to prolong blooming.
- Will also need some supplemental watering in Phoenix summers to prolong blooming.
